We are so proud that Dad's passion for giving back has become a unique part of our family history. The gift he included in his Will has created a legacy of hope for future generations of Australians.


We owe so many of the good things in our lives to Dad.

I'll always remember The Alfred

My daughter was only six weeks old when I suddenly noticed something was very wrong. She didn't seem to be breathing and was turning blue.

In a state of panic and confusion, my late husband and I rushed her to The Alfred. She was immediately put into a humidity crib and given oxygen.

Early next morning we were elated to see that our daughter had rallied and was slowly recovering.

The doctors discovered she had RH Factor, a blood incompatibility between parents, and a condition that can typically affect future children. She needed to stay in hospital for tests for another week or so before we could finally bring her home safely.

I'll never forget the efforts of the wonderful hospital staff that night. Their knowledge, skills and teamwork - but most of all their expert care and compassion.

I want to contribute to making a real change for people who may find themselves in my situation in the future.

That's why I will continue to support The Alfred, and why I chose to remember this amazing hospital in my Will.

I'd always wanted to run the Melbourne Marathon, and trained hard to get fit for the event. Then, just short of four kilometres from the finish line, my body started to feel like it was shutting down.

It was absolutely terrifying.

My heart was pounding and my legs were both hit with painful cramps. I just stumbled to the side of the road and called out for help. The last thing I remember was the paramedic's bike skidding to a halt next to me.

It was a real shock to go from being a fit and healthy 29-year-old to being in such agonising pain and so unwell.

In The Alfred's Emergency & Trauma Centre, I was diagnosed with rhabdomyolysis – a serious condition in which the muscles deteriorate so rapidly, it can cause

kidney failure. I ended up having dialysis in hospital and that treatment continued as an outpatient.

But now, a few short years later, I've made a full recovery. Since then I got married to my amazing wife, Claire, and was able to enjoy our wedding day together in good health.

I started donating to The Alfred as a way of thanking them for their compassionate care. I'm now thinking about including a gift in my Will, to acknowledge the wonderful medical team who cared for me.

We're so fortunate to have The Alfred always here for us. The doctors and nurses do an incredible job, and I will forever be grateful.
