

As children, Byron and his sister spent years in an orphanage. Without any welfare in those days, their mother simply couldn't afford to care for them after their father left.

Byron vividly remembers clinging to his mother's leg during her monthly visits, and the trauma he felt not knowing if he was wanted or loved by anyone.


These humble beginnings instilled a deep sense of compassion in Byron. Often he would help the nuns change the linen for the younger boys who wet the bed.

By the time he left the orphanage, Byron was determined and hard-working, and went on to have a successful career including owning a hotel and a printing company. Decades later, Byron got the opportunity to ride along in one of our Missionbeat vans.

He saw in the men and women on the street something of his younger self. "People are struggling not because of their own irresponsibility; they're struggling because of other circumstances."

Impressed by the work of Mission Australia and reminded of his own difficult circumstances as an orphan, Byron made the decision to leave a gift to Mission Australia in his Will.

He lost his home after developing severe depression and suffering anxiety. Brett was referred to a Mission Australia transitional accommodation property. He was supported with one-on-one counselling, and over time took part in a diverse range of group programs to holistically assist in his recovery.

As Brett's health improved, we helped him apply for social housing, then assisted him to move into his flat and furnish it once his application was approved.

Benjamin Short founded the Sydney City Mission in 1862.

How to leave a gift to Mission Australia in your Will

After you have looked after your loved ones, a gift in your Will can make a life-changing difference to people in need.

Here are three ways to leave a gift to Mission Australia in your Will:

1. Your entire estate:

After expenses and taxes are settled, you may choose to leave the remainder of your estate to Mission Australia. To gift your entire estate, write: To gift your entire estate, we suggest the following wording:

I give the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to Mission Australia - (ACN 000 002 522) Registered Office Level 7, 580 George St, Sydney NSW for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of an executive officer at the time, shall be sufficient discharge of my executor's duty.

2. Residual gift:

You may choose to leave a percentage of the residue of your estate as a gift to Mission Australia. To leave a residual gift, write: To leave a residual gift, we suggest the following wording:

I give and bequeath ---% of the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to Mission Australia - (ACN 000 002 522) Registered Office Level 7, 580 George St, Sydney NSW for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of an executive officer at the time, shall be sufficient discharge of my executor's duty.

3. Pecuniary gift:

To leave Mission Australia a specified amount, we suggest the following wording:

l give \$_____to Mission Australia - (ACN 000 002 522) for its general purposes, free of all duties and declare that the receipt of an executive officer at the time, shall be sufficient discharge of my executor's duty.

Leaving a gift in your Will depends on your personal preference and circumstances. The best way to arrange a gift to Mission Australia in your Will is to speak with your solicitor to create or update your Will. A solicitor can ensure that your estate is distributed in a way that best meets your wishes and supports your loved ones.
