St Vincent de Paul Society was founded when a group of young students gave their own supply of winter firewood to a widow living in poverty in their neighbourhood.

That was nearly 190 years ago. But the same spirit of compassion, selflessness and care for others is still at the heart of everything St Vincent de Paul society does today.

Back in 1833, homelessness, hunger and unemployment were on the rise. Great political and social change left many feeling unsettled and anxious – while others were simply left out. And a disease epidemic had the population terrified.

Today, we're facing many similar challenges – so the generosity of Vinnies supporters is as vital as it ever was. And as that gift of firewood over a century ago proves, an enduring legacy can begin with a single act of kindness.

Providing safe homes

Gifts in Wills help Vinnies run more than 25 crisis and accommodation services across NSW. They provide a safe haven for people who've lost their homes, and give them the stability and support they need to rebuild their lives.



Escaping violence

If women and children don't receive the right support, the impact of family violence can last a lifetime. Thanks to gifts in Wills, Vinnies can offer crisis accommodation, long term help, and practical assistance for people fleeing domestic violence.



Early intervention

An act of kindness today can often prevent individuals and families from falling deep into crisis tomorrow. With support from gifts in Wills, Vinnies can go into communities to identify people at immediate risk – and provide everything from food vouchers to budgeting support.



Better futures

AMY'S HAPPY SHE'S NOW IN A BETTER, SAFER PLACE

Before coming to Vinnies, Amy was desperate to escape her abusive husband. She knew she had to get away to keep her children safe.

As part of her husband's behaviour, he'd put barriers in her way whenever she wanted to see her family, effectively isolating her. But Amy plotted her escape with help from the family she'd been deprived of for too long.

Amy first spent two weeks with her mother and sister, then was forced to move from refuge to refuge in search of a more permanent solution, before finally arriving at the Marian Centre – a service run by Vinnies for women with children escaping domestic and family violence.

There, things began to improve.

After several months at the Marian Centre with the support of the Vinnies team, Amy was able to secure a house of her own, and to begin feeling like part of a community.

After years of torment, Amy is finally living without fear and is determined to make a better life for her children.

HARRY IS GRATEFUL FOR HIS NEW, SOBER LIFE

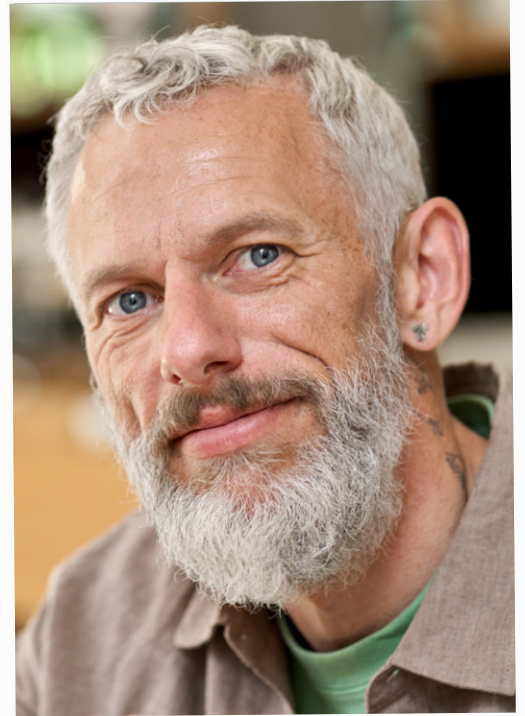
It wasn't that long ago that Harry's every waking moment was consumed by an alcohol addiction.

Aged 57, Harry first came into contact with the Matthew Talbot Clinic in 2021. He received intervention treatment from the on-site GP and psychiatrist, as well as daily supportive care.

Thanks to their support, Harry has managed to remain sober for an extended period with an improved mental wellbeing. The clinic staff have also successfully applied for funding through the NDIS, so he can access a support worker three times a week.

Harry now says that he feels a sense of contentment each time the waves of the ocean wash over him.

**YOUR KIND
OF EASY**

Leaving a gift in your Will can make a powerful, long-lasting difference. But the process is surprisingly fast and easy – and there's very little paperwork. You simply need to decide on the gift you'd like to leave, then let your solicitor know your wishes.

YOUR loved ones come first

Your Will lets you look after your loved ones, long into the future. If you're considering leaving a gift to Vinnies, the people closest to you should still be your first priority. You may also want to include them in your plans, and let them know about your gift.

YOUR kind of gift

The gift that often has the greatest impact is called a 'residual' gift. It's what's left over from your estate, after all your loved ones have been taken care of. You can also leave a set amount of money, or a specific item or asset. It's entirely up to you.

YOUR lawyer can help

Your Will is a legal document, so you'll need to ask your solicitor or estate planner to update or amend it. The Vinnies Gift in Wills team can give your solicitor all the details they'll need, and even provide you with sample wording for your Will.

Every gift left in a Will – whether large or small – makes a lasting difference. Even a gift of 1% of your estate will help people who are vulnerable, in poverty or facing a crisis, for generations to come.
